18th AVA Biennial Convention is coming to Central Florida!

The 18th Biennial Convention of the AVA is scheduled to be held in Orlando. The dates have been approved by the National Executive Council for Saturday - Sunday, April 20 - 28, 2013. The dates may be more than a year in the future, but planning starts now!

Marvin Stokes, Vice-President of the American Volkssport Association and past president of the Happy Wanderers (Daytona Club) was has been the driving force in the decision to have Florida host the convention. He sees it as an opportunity for the Florida Volkssport Association and all the Florida Clubs to showcase their terrific abilities to put on wonderful, exciting and creative events.

The National Convention Committee has pretty well finalized the scheduling for events, though (except for the dates) locations and details can be modified as time goes by.

A tentative schedule would look something like this:

Monday, Apr 22 - 2 events in Orlando area

Trailmaster's Report

We had great walking weather and good participation the last 2 months. Sixty walkers joined us on the 21st of January to walk at the Little Econ and Blanchard Park and about 30 at the Orlando Lakes route YRE.

The main topic I would like to discuss is the AVA Convention in 2013 here in Orlando. The Convention is at the end of April that year and as with all Conventions will require some local support. We recently were provided a list of some positions and there is still some discussion as to what the professional Planner being hired will do. This will get sorted in the next month and the club can expect to be asked for specific help. The conventions are fun and the preparations are tedious so we will have to have your support to make the walks here a success. Just a glimpse of what we do for walks in our area: 5-800 walkers, most preregistered, arrive at a start, are checked in by 6-8 volunteers and walk. We establish one or two checkpoints with 2 shifts of 2 folks each and also manage the finish. As you can see the walk itself takes some support. Of course we have to mark the route and provide water & refreshments (500 walkers grab lots of candy/fruit/drinks).



So when we get more detailed information we will be asking for help with some of the preparation and for the walks themselves. Last year we had quite a few volunteers throughout the year and this will just be a bit intense for the week of the Convention. I know we can count on the help.

Walking in Grand Coulee

In 2011 Joan and I visited the town of Grand Coulee that has quite the look of the 30s when the huge dam was started on the Columbia River. The attraction of course is the Dam. There is also the museum that is at the Visitor Center, the dam tour that is very interesting, and, in the summer, the 10 PM laser show on the dam.

Before the walk we took the tour of the dam and it's interior machinery. The dam security is quite tight so we went through that and and a bus took us into the secure area. After a tour in the west side of the dam (added in the 1980s), the bus took us to the top of the dam that is no longer a public road. That was a spectacular view of the river, lake behind, the power lines, and the irrigation tubes moving millions of gallons of water to irrigate farms in eastern Washington.

The walk in the town starts at the Visitor Center and proceeds into the former government buildings and living quarters where the homes are very well maintained and nicely landscaped. The view of the dam with water spilling over is quite impressive as you cross the old bridge across the Columbia. The bridge has stands with historical information on the building of the town and dam. Once across the bridge you enter the area where the construction company workers lived, a small casino, and a road up to the dam tour. After walking through here we stopped at the Casino to eat and then back to the museum and Visitor Center.

After spending time in the museum we picked out a spot for the 30-minute laser show that was well done recalling the long history of eastern Washington, the impact of this large river, and the coming of settlers in the 1800s.


