Registration packages were provided to all clubs, Lifetime, and Associate members about 12 November and the package and registration sheet is available on the Convention web site. The deadline for registration to reserve awards, convention souvenirs, select workshops, attend socials is March 21. This allows us to prepare the events, transportation, and souvenirs quantities to minimize overages. We appreciate your registering as early as possible. Please note the special option to adopt our mascot and receive the unique Save the Manatee Tee (shown on the convention web site souvenir page) has an earlier deadline of February 1 due to a longer order time.

As with all conventions we have some great successes and some bumps. The Marriott has been very helpful and will provide a super venue for the convention. The two poolside socials will be fun parties. The nine walk events are progressing well with Florida Parks and the Brevard County Endangered Land program co-hosting walks. Year Round Event Walk Discounts for MFM Members

Did you know? MFM offers discounts (Frequent Walker Coupons) for members to walk any of our 14 YREs. These are sold in packs of 10 for \$20, a 33% savings, as a way to encourage participation and give something back to members. These coupons are available at walks. They are used like the start cards at YREs and simply check the walk and other data like Registration Sheet number and leave it in the Used Envelopes folder in the YRE box or submit with the Remote Registration form for any of the six Southeast Florida Events.

Save the Manatee Club and AVA Link Up

Candace Purcell and Patrick Rose, Executive Directors of the American Volkssport Association and the Save the Manatee Club (SMC) respectively, signed a Memorandum of Agreement for joint information exchanges as well as support of the 18th AVA Biennial Convention. This 31 year old not for profit organization focuses on education about, and the conservation of, manatees in Florida, Alabama, the Wider Caribbean, and parts of West Africa. AVA's outdoor members and wide backgrounds and experiences from all over the United States can appreciate the conservations of endangered animals. AVA appreciates their support of the Convention. SMC has a following of over 60,000 people from around the world who help obtain stronger manatee and habitat protection measures. Thanks in large part to SMC's advocacy, over 300,000 acres of Florida's water bodies are now protected for the manatee. SMC also supports and conducts research, and the rescue, rehabilitation, and release of sick, injured, and orphaned manatees, both in the U.S. and internationally. During the AVA convention, a good place to see manatees is at SeaWorld, where rescued manatees are in rehabilitation. Many of these manatees will eventually be released back into the wild. In late April/early May, the manatees will be gone from Blue Spring and dispersed throughout the St.

Johns River where they spend their summers, but visit Blue Spring during the winter months, and there is a good chance you can see Floyd, along with



hundreds of other manatees, taking refuge from the cold in the spring run.

The slow moving "Sea Cows" are found throughout Florida's waterways year-round. During winter cold snaps, a large contingent is at Blue Spring State Park, 30 miles north of Orlando. The constant 72-degree spring water is a haven for the Manatee when temperatures drop in Florida. The Crystal River/Kings Bay areas on Florida's west coast are regular winter bases also.

The convention Mascot is Floyd, a 34+ year-old Manatee that winters in Blue Spring. During the convention you will see our many volunteers display Floyd on their bright yellow "Staff" Tee Shirts. We wrote about Floyd in the TAW October-November issue of the TAW and you can find that article on the convention Web Site. Convention participants have the option of adopting Floyd and receiving the special Tee Shirt pictured with Manatees and Otters on the back and both AVA and SMC logos on the front – one of a kind. This special offer is good if paid in the registration packet by 1 February (10-15 days to go).
