A Walk and Visit Experience

In August, my wife, Nancy, and I spent two weeks in a part of the world many have never been before. We took a land and river cruise trip to Vietnam and Cambodia. I checked the IVV site to see if either country was part of the IVV. Unfortunately they were not. This did not deter us from doing a lot of walking during our trip. We left Orlando and three flights latter arrived in Ho Chi Minh City (formerly Saigon). After a night stay, we flew to Hanoi where we spent three days touring and yes, walking the city. We saw the tomb of Ho Chi Minh, the Hanoi Hilton (POW camp during the "American War"...that is what the Vietnamese call the war) and a few temples. Then we took a bus trip to Halong Bay which is a few hours north of Hanoi. We boarded a boat and travelled amongst the various islands. Halong Bay is extremely beautiful and I highly recommend a visit if you are in this part of the world. Spent one night on the boat and then it was off to Hanoi to catch our flight to Siem Reap, Cambodia. We were there for three days and visited several temple cities including Angkor Wat (one of the largest religious monuments in the world). Then we were driven to the Mekong River and boarded our river cruise. Included were three days in Phnom Penh, capital of Cambodia. It is a growing city in southeast Asia and had many areas for us to explore. Part of the Cambodian dark history was the Killing Fields. We visited one of these outside of Phnom Penh...viewing the area gave us reflection on how mankind can be so cruel. We were also able to walk through the palace grounds in the capital city. Then it was back to travelling on the Mekong River. A highlight was stopping to visit a Cambodian elementary school. The 10-12 year old's had just completed their English lesson. We then sailed to just south of Ho Chi Minh City and departed for our hotel. One of our fellow traveler's was the pilot of the C-5 which was responsible for picking up the orphans at the end of the Vietnam War. Unfortunately, shortly after departing Tan Son Nhut Airbase, the airplane developed mechanical problems and crashed while trying to return to the base. Due to the aviation expertise of the crew, 179 passengers survived the crash. We were able to go with aircraft commander and tour the area where the plane crashed. While we were not able to do any official volksmarches, we did do a lot of walking during our trip.




