It's known for Venice Beach, with its offshore coral reef, and Caspersen Beach, where shark teeth are often found. Multi-use trails hug the Intracoastal Waterway in Venetian Waterway Park. Venice has been listed in many publications as being the "Shark's Tooth Capital of the World". It hosts the Shark's Tooth Festival every year to celebrate the abundance of fossilized shark's teeth that can be found on its coastal shores. High temperatures are in the low 80s and mornings in the low 60s. Hotel reservation information will be available by mid March. 

## **AVA President's Message** (Extract reprinted from The American Wanderer, Mar 2019) By David Bonewitz, AVA President



I believe everyone recognizes that AVA is struggling financially. The board and staff are working hard to find areas to trim the budget. While we are seeking partners, other income streams, and investing in a national marketing plan, the long pole in the tent remains participation. Unless we can increase our participation (and the resulting income that produces) we will have to take much more draconian steps to bring balance to the budget. When it comes down to it, the national leadership and the national office can do what they can, but the ultimate success rests with the local clubs.

Participation is where our clubs must step up their game. Do you conduct interesting and fun traditional events or group events where you can meet and greet new participants? Do you reach out to new folks and make them feel welcome? Do you make the most of social media, such as Facebook, Twitter, Meet-Up, etc? Do you seek publicity before and after your events to make your club known in your community? Are you the positive face of the sport? Are you really looking to expand your small comfortable club by inviting participation by new folks? By the board's estimate, we have three to four years to make something happen before we are literally standing on the edge of a cliff. If we are going to keep this sport alive, we must make the necessary effort at the grassroots level. This is the time when we all must be the change that we want to see locally and nationally.

#### **Groupworks – an AVA Communication Initiative**

This article is the 1st introduction to this new communications tool that simplifies some of our management responsibilities and allows all members to receive updated information periodically. It allows direct communications within the membership and reminders. You select the frequency of communications. GroupWorks has in place a strict privacy policy. Those that are within GroupWorks experienced possibly excess number of messages as we entered 5 planned events and made a few posts to get information. You can select the number of posts you get where you sign up.

#### What is Groupworks

GroupWorks is a free club management platform that simplifies member communications, handles event scheduling, connects clubs to potential sponsors and frees up quality time for group leaders and members to do more of what they love, walking! In an effort to grow AVA and streamline communication for all members AVA decided to explore GroupWorks' club management online platform. GroupWorks provides online tools in a simple to use format to enhance management.

#### How did MFM start with GroupWorks?

AVA first implementation was in November to all 220 club officers, 10 state organizations officers and National Officers. MFM officers carefully limited those involved for the 1st two months and then added 14 more members in February that are volunteers for positions like Route Monitor, Membership, Publicity, Web manager. This was to develop some usage information and find issues. In mid-March we held a meeting to discuss what we had learned, how MFM could benefit by its use, and how we could implement this with the total membership. This will allow us to provide more information before asking you to join in.

#### The goals for MFM are:

- 1. Manage the club and members via group messaging and emails
- 2. Event management (One source for FB, web, and publicity data)
- 3. Collect payments (Future consideration)
- 4. Share photos, videos, ideas and updates (It is not a FB, but info on the last event, ideas for the next event, and inputs to all members)
- 5. Other uses as we develop the system.

Rosemary will make this topic part of her comments at our annual meeting on April 13.

AVA's discussion was placed in the AVA monthly Checkpoint in December.

<u>GroupWorks</u> has a large stable of organizations from RVing to quilting to gardening to motorcycling clubs. AVA is a recent addition with 220 individual clubs and thousands of club members. Go to the link for a summary on how it works. Questions ask Rosemary or Mike.
